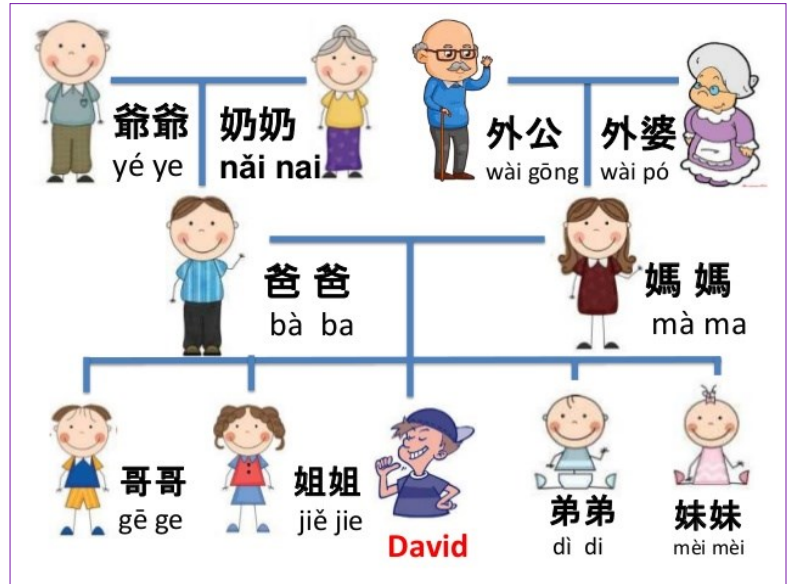


All About You

3. The sports you play: tennis, biking, swimming and others.

4. Your appearance: mouth, nose, eyes (big or small, color), hair (long or short, color), if wear glasses (戴眼鏡 dài yǎn jìng)
5. Your nationality and languages you can speak, read and write.
